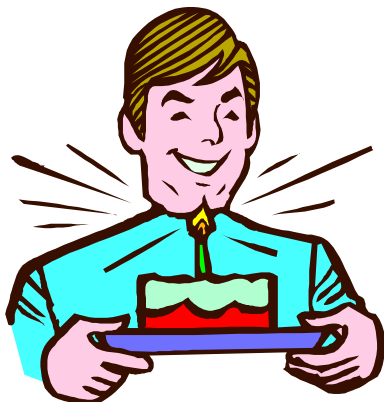

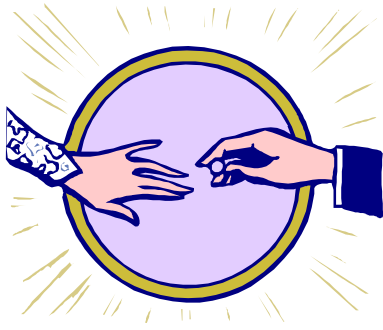

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

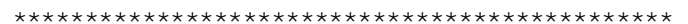
